Living with Wildfire Risk is no longer a seasonal concern. Despite rain and cooler temperatures (and yes, even the fluffy white stuff!), the National Fire Protection Agency anticipate this year's aggressive season to extend well into late fall. Additionally, wildfires seem to spring up earlier every year. But brush, grass and wildfires don't have to be disasters.

The North Sanpete Community Wildfire Council (CWC) is a group of neighbors committed to reducing wildfire risk in our communities. In conjunction with forestry and fire officials, we have designed a protection plan (the CWPP) to identify our specific needs and outline projects to meet these needs. Working this plan allows us to receive financial assistance for fire safety (in the form of grants), as well as in-kind services (for example, fuel mitigation.) This year alone we have received:

- \$500.00 grant from the National Fire Protection Agency for participating in the Wildfire Community Preparedness Day. Our cleanup project resulted in the collection and disposal of over 4500 pounds of hazardous material from over 200 tires.
- 1,260 hours of services from the Forestry, Fire and State Lands in Hideaway Valley and Blackhawk Estates. This resulted in over 20 properties (and still counting!) receiving risk assessments, fuel mitigation and chipping services.
- 750 hours of services from the Forestry, Fire and State Lands in Panorama Woods.

Please join us Tuesday, January 23rd at 6:00 p.m. at the Indianola Valley Fire Department Station to share your ideas on how to make our communities safer with regard to wildfire. Such contributions become projects as we update our Community Wildfire Protection Plan. All residents, property owners, family and friends are welcome! Thank you for your insights and presence!
